9. Treasurer's Report, Denise Renaud
  - Current balance: \$2810.08
  - Income: Eligible CAN grant that we will receive for this year is \$2218.07
  - Expenses: \$2000 of the balance will be going to the purchase of shade trees.
  - Once we receive the CAN grant and have purchased the shade trees we will have approximately \$3000 remaining for this year (\$3028.15)

  - Traffic Calming Riverside Drive, Michael Penwarden
    - The City has been contacted regarding putting a stop sign at Riverside and Winchester. The CAN has been advised to submit an application for a traffic count before decision can be made. Kevin Despot asked about the possibility of bringing the bollards back as the bylaws regarding public support requirements has changed. The CAN will look into the matter and report at next meeting.
  - Clean up Blitz. Michael Penwarden
    - The CAN will not be participating in the event this year but at anytime could organize an event if needed.
  - York Street Playground, Denise Renaud
    - With the help of the city, we will be planting approximately 10 mixed species of shade trees along the north side of the fence. If everything goes as planned, this will be happening in a couple of weeks on May 13th.
    - We also met with Katie Hahn who is a resident of Ward 10. She is taking a course through Pollinator Partnership and will be the lead on planning a pollinator habitat at the base of the hill. The size of the habitat will be dependent on the number of volunteers, budget, and practical aspects to the site. We may be looking for a few volunteers to prep the garden and plant seeds this fall.
    - The city will also be cleaning up the dead branches under the overhanging tree on the back west of the park. All living aspects of the tree will remain intact. Lastly, a new basketball net will replace the old one.

  - Community Gardens: Michael reported that members of the St. Peter's United Church on York Street are hoping to gather interest and support for building a Community Gardens behind the church. Contact Gillian Schell at 705-671-0185
